Thank you for your letter, and my sympathies about the death of the California Press in your life. I believe that Miss Dobbie, whom I know very well, is perfectly honest. Since you were not in time two years after your Ph.D. your legitimate rights of having your dissertation printed in the Historical Series were expired and for commercial enterprise your book may not have seemed too rewarding. I would certainly try it with the Nijhoff people at Claremont. They can't do more than say no but of course you are losing again precious time. I am really very sorry that things have turned out so unfavourably.

No news from this end of the line. I am going up to Toronto for the meeting of the Mediaeval Academy and am going by the end of this month to Dumbarton Oaks.
