Dear Treasure of Printers,

I just had a letter from Pan[ofsky] in which he tells me (a) that his liaisons with the Bollingen Foundation had worked through his publisher Kurt Wolff, who however left this country and went back to Europe for good; (b) that the Bollingen people would not support a book printed and published outside the U.S.

The one thing I could do, though only after my return in September, is to talk to Robert Oppenheimer and ask him whether the strings of the Institute purse could be opened far enough to let \$1,000 slip out. Frankly, however, I would doubt it because our publication fund is rather strained at present. I might try nevertheless, since no other bright idea has occurred to me. Oppenheimer is at present in the Caribbean.

I am sending you a book which will prove to be useful for you, your academic life rather than your work.
