Argues that Americans put too much faith in idea education produces equality. As of 1973 liberal educators mounting an attack on book. Jencks maintains that income equality is attainable but not thru educ. alone--liberals looking for simple answers to complex problems--educ. long the formula for progress and is ex. of "conventional wisdom" and needs to be dislodged.
